
## Let's take a journey to Ancient Egypt

Wadi el-Hudi lies in the south of Egypt, a country in Africa.




Can you find where the Ancient Egyptians lived?



A stele was found on the archaeological site of Wadi el-Hudi. Connect the points from 1 to 36 to find out what it represents!

















Several amethysts (purple stones)are in the treasure chest. How many are there?




Number from 1 to 6 the amethysts coming from Wadi El-Hudi, from the smallest to the largest.


